

# GLOBE Asia - Pacific Regional Meeting of Country Coordinators

Initially, the Regional Meeting was planned to take place in Taiwan, however, due to the pandemic situation it was shifted to online settings. RCO organized an online Zoom event that stretched over 3 days. The first day agenda (Regional GLE) was for Students in the region and the other two days for CCs/ACCs (GLOBE Community meeting) were open to any member of the GLOBE community, therefore attracting teachers, students, trainers, scientist and other members. Altogether, 60 individuals registered for the event. The participation at the sessions was changing as not everyone could or wanted to follow the meeting for the full agenda. The maximum number of users connected at a session was around 49.

The event was organized by Asia and Pacific Region Coordination Office in cooperation with the GLOBE Program & GLOBE Partner - Taiwan.

The GLOBE Virtual Regional Meeting of Country Coordinators, during 02-04 May 2021, which brought together 14 GLOBE Country Coordinators, Dr. Tony .P. Murphy, Director . GIO, Dr. Desh Bandhu, Coordinator- RCO, Dr. Ying-Hwa Kuo, Director of UCAR Community Programs Assistant, Dr. Chih-Peng Chu, Director General, Department of International Cooperation & Science Education, Ministry of Science and Technology, Ms. Rhiannon Bramer, Environment, Science, Technology and Health officer, American Institute in Taiwan, Assistant Country Coordinator, Scientists, GLOBE Trainer's & Students from Asia & Pacific Region to discuss GLOBE achievements in schools & students activities science the last Regional Meeting & Challenges & Achievements of "Doing GLOBE Virtually" and ways to strengthen the GLOBE Program in Asia – Pacific region and further prepare GLOBE students for more active participation on different GLOBE activities.

# Day 1: 02<sup>nd</sup> May - Sunday - Asia & Pacific Regional GLE

#### **Opening**

Welcome by organizers.

The GLOBE Asia - Pacific Regional GLE was hosted both online for the students in the region & offline for Students in Taiwan. **Dr. Pay Liam Lin**, Country Coordinator, **GLOBE Partner - Taiwan** moderated the session. The session started with online keynote speech by **Dr. Ying-Hwa** (Bill\*) Kuo, **Director** of UCAR Community Programs on the topic **Taiwan-US Cooperation in COSMIC-3** & FORMOSAT-7 (TBC). The Presentation was very intresting and students enjoied the topic a lot.

After Dr. Bill Kuo, presentation Dr. Pay Liam then ask Dr. Chih-Peng Chu, Director General Department of International Cooperation & Science Education, Ministry of Science and Technology to address the particiants, during Dr. Chu address he encougaresthe students to continue their research under GLOBE and appricate the students efforts to enagage in hands-on activities during pandemic. After that Ms. Rhiannon Bramer, Environment, Science, Technology and Health officer, American Institute in Taiwan address the participants both off-line & online and inform them about the succept of AIT for the GLOBE program in Taiwan. After that Dr. Pay Liam request Dr. Desh Bandhu, Coordinator, GLOBE Regional Coordination Office for Asia-Pacific to address the participants, Dr. Bandhu thank the Country Coordinator - GLOBE Partner Taiwan & MOST for organizing the Regional GLE and conguratulated them for holding the onsite (offline) GLE for the GLOBE students in Taiwan and conguratulate & thanks students for participating in the event. After Dr. Desh address Dr. Pay Liam ask Dr. Tony P. Murphy, Director, GLOBE Implementation Office, USA to gave his address Dr. Tony said that after "seeing all the studesns in a hall to engage in GLOBE activities & sharing their research that they have conducted during these difficut time it lift his heart and make him hopefull for the future GLOBE Activities in the region". Dr. Tony Concuratluate Asia - Pacific RCO & GLOBE Taiwan for organizing a wondefull regional GLE.

The session was organized in the format of virtual science symposium, combined of student research presentations and student video submissions. The Regional GLE session was on collaboration around the topic of GLOBE Protocol used during the pandemic and what students have leared new while doing GLOBE Virtually with presentations by students.

10 Students team from, India, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, Thailand & Vietnam participated in the online Regional GLE & approx 150 students on the offline setting (onsite – in Taiwa). Durig the Regional GLE 548 participants joined the seesion through the webex meeting link.

The conclusion was that RCO will follow & Promote more GLE, exchange & CampaignProgram in the regio to motivate schools to focus on GLOBE Basic protocol related project and to make a connection to another schools in the region.

## Day 2: 03<sup>rd</sup> May - Monday - Country Coordinator Meeting

#### Challenges & Achievements of "Doing GLOBE Virtually"

The Country Coordinator meeting started by GLOBE Program updates – presentation by Tony Murphy, GIO and an Introduction to Ms. Denise "Skye" Yost, Assistant Director, GIO and presentation by Dr. Desh Bandhu, RCO on the activities carried out / webinar organized in since the pandemic started and how it has benefitted the regional Community and Q&A from participants.

#### What is new at GLOBE website

New development of the Data Entry, Visualizations and GLOBE website and apps upgrade was presented by Mr. Cornell Lewis, SSAI. Q&A followed.

#### Presentation by GLOBE Country Coordinators

The theme of this Year Asia and Pacific Regional Meeting is Challenges & Achievements of "doing GLOBE virtually" to showcase best practices & exchange of the experience with digital learning, distant learning, online cooperative learning approaches and other lessons learned from the partial or full close down of the schools due to the pandemic. Discussion based on the examples of GLOBE good practice that CCs shared during the presentation. CCs reacted on each other's presentation – finding similarities, asking questions, adding their own ideas and experience. RCO will follow up on selected examples of good practice: We will ask CCs to prepare a Star article about their events/achievements, we plan to focus more on the topic that more countries had in common (Air Quality, Hydrosphere).

## Day 3: 04th May - Tuesday - Country Coordinator Meeting

#### **GLOBE Working Group**

A discussion was organized with the GLOBE working Group Member in the region to help the regional community on how to disseminate information to the Region about the working group and what best suited to the community and how the community can benefit from that be more engaging. Q&A followed.

#### GLOBE Student Exchange and GLOBE Regional Campaigns

The focus of this topic was to develop a spirit of scientific learning, adventure and discovery by organizing Regional Campaigns, Expedition, and Students Research & Exchange program in the Region. Asia and Pacific region is very actively promote these activities because it has benefited the regional Community significantly and has helped the student in our region learn, research & to adapt and to the new ecosystem which strengthens and expands their knowledge and skills on STEM education as well as on the cultural side. Followed by Q&A from participants

After the presentations, there was a discussion on the opportunities for international campaign on Air Quality. The conclusion was that RCO will follow the topic together with CCs and motivate schools to focus on Air Quality Campaign & related project to increase school participation and collaboration among schools.

#### Discussion on GLOBE Strategy Plan

RCO also had a discussion with CCs in the Region about the status of GLOBE Strategy Plan (2018-2023) and how far we are in our goals for 2022. The implementation of GLOBE Strategic Plan was also discussed in light of the Current COVID -19 Pandemic and how to reach our Strategic Goals.

#### Closing of the Regional Meeting

RCO wrapped up the 3 days of the meeting and showed overview of the audience – 60 participants from 13 countries.
